- allocate resources & responsibility
- result in an **actionable plan**

Hornepayne strategies:

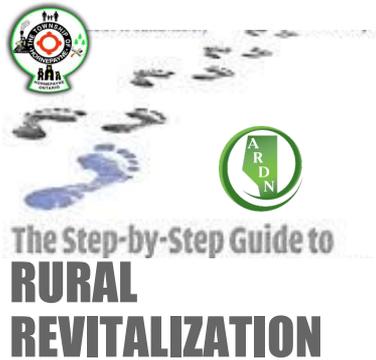
- 1) Conduct community consultations to:
 - create awareness of issues & solutions
 - determine what the community needs, wants & supports
 - get buy-in for important decisions
- 2) Conduct research into available resources and successful strategies
 - “cherry pick” the best solutions for Hornepayne
- 3) Find solutions that address Hornepayne’s unique challenges
 - e.g. encourage seasonal and non-permanent workers to make Hornepayne home

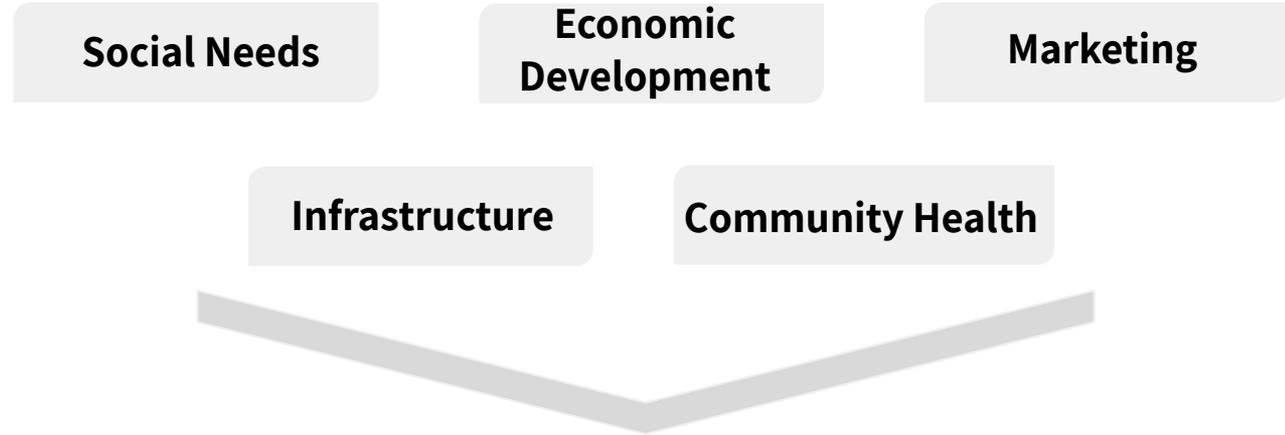

Proposed Project Activities	Estimated Timeline
Project kick-off and set up (including hiring staff)	1 month
Detailed review of Hornepayne’s existing plans; identify gaps and areas that require updating	1 month
Fill any identified planning gaps that are urgent (if any)	1 to 3 months
Conduct environmental scans of available resources and what other communities have done successfully	2 to 3 months
Conduct community consultations	2 to 3 months
Begin preparing Master Planning document	2 to 3 months
Begin planning economic development activities; begin early implementation of one or two key activities	3 to 4 months
Begin work on branding and marketing	3 to 4 months
Seek additional funding for Phase 2	On-going

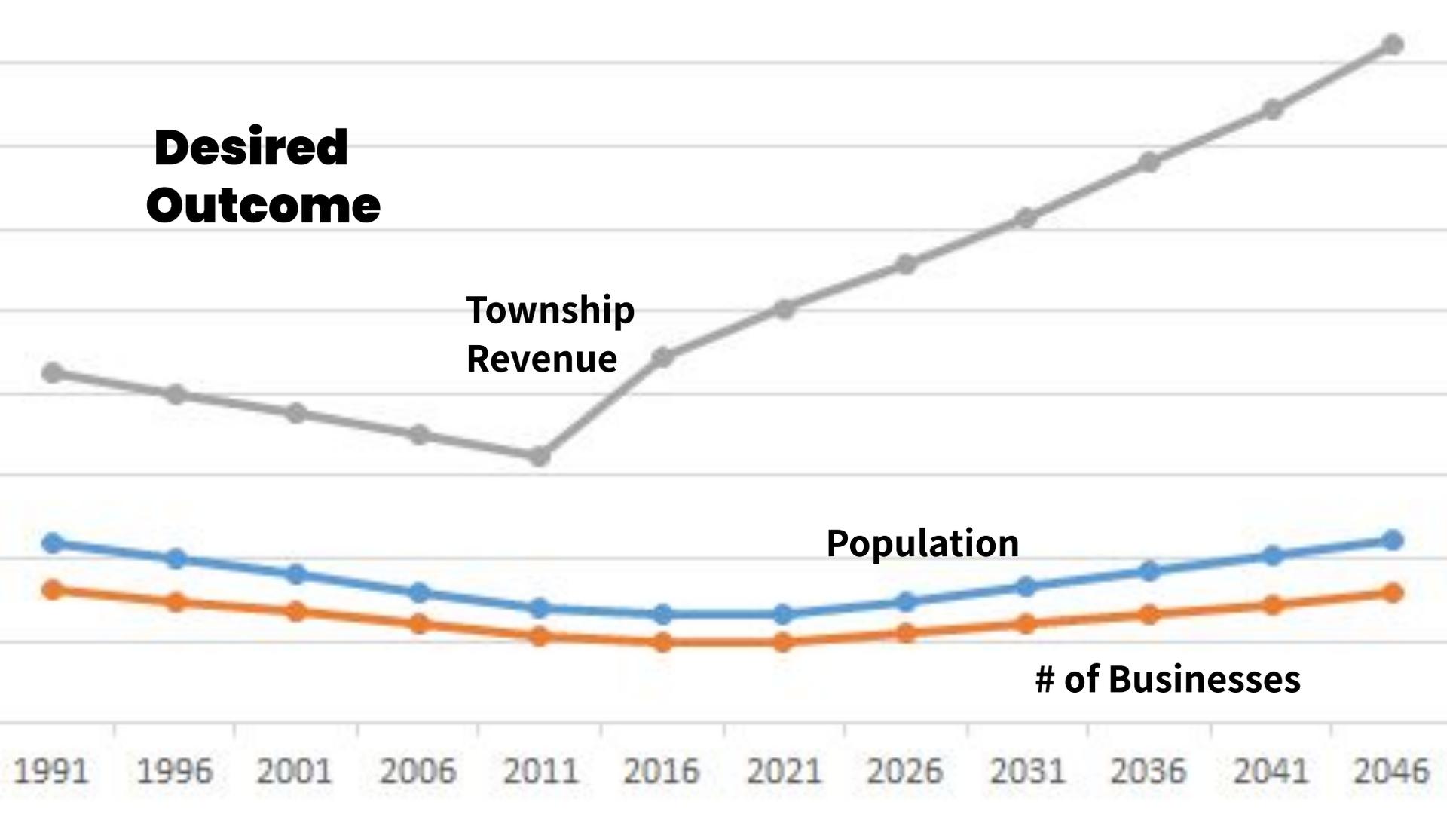
